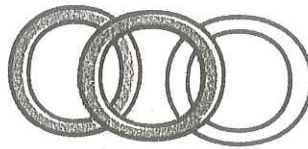

CURRENT ACHIEVEMENTS

Since our October 2010 report to you, we have undertaken the under listed projects/activities with your support and cooperation, and to the glory of God.

- 1) Re-fixed N5,000,000 in a deposit account with First Bank of Nigeria Plc for another 90 days.
- 2) Paid entitlements to two of our former employees, Miss Euphermia Ezeanyim and Miss Ogochukwu Ucheagwu, who resigned recently from the employment of the club.

- 2) Paid entitlements to two of our former employees, Miss Euphermia Ezeanyim and Miss Ogochukwu Ucheagwu, who resigned recently from the employment of the club.
3. Purchased plumbing materials and mobilized the workers for the on going repair work in block A of the club's guest house.
- 4) Purchased paint and painted the outside of the main hall, reception area, kitchen area, the bush bar, steps and fourteen rooms in block A of the guest houses, the presidential flats, Ekenedilichukwu executive hall, and treated them with waterproof chemicals.
- 5) Purchased and fixed dark bronze aluminum sliding windows with mosquito nets in the fourteen rooms being repaired in block A of our guest houses.
- 6) Serviced one of the new 100 KVA electricity power generators.
- 7) Attended induction of new members' ceremony at our Warri branch on November 6, 2010, inducted eleven (11) new members and realized a total of N759, 000 as detailed below.

- 10) Purchased a new operational vehicle, a Mitsubishi wagon, for the use of the club since the vehicles formally being used are now bad and unserviceable.
- 11) Work on the tarring of the access road into the club's premises continued during the period. This completed road project would be commissioned

tomorrow morning by 10. a.m. by our Patrons/Trustees before the AGM commences. We are therefore pleased to invite all our members to grace the occasion and participate in making history for all of us.

- 12) Proper communication and liaison were maintained with all the branches both in Nigeria and overseas during the period.


